Automotive Service Technology is a state-of-the-art, nationally-certified Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) program which provides students with 540 hours of intensive training to successfully complete 423 potential tasks in four areas of Automotive Repair: Brakes, Steering and Suspension, Electricity and Electronics, and Internal Combustion Gasoline Engine Performance.



Program Skills & Certifications:

In addition to attending all of the hours and executing all of the tasks, students are required to take two end-of-course ASE examinations at the end of each semester in 10th and 11th grade. Students are encouraged to join professional automotive organizations.

Internships:

An internship, dual enrollment, special projects, or work-study can be selected after the 11th grade year. All 11th graders are required to attend the WT Career Fair and present a resume and portfolio to potential employers.

Articulation with CCBC:

We have a standing articulation agreement in place with CCBC and UTI that allows students to be awarded credit hours for the work completed at Western.
