SAT

SAT TEST DAY



Western Tech juniors will take the SAT in school on **Wednesday, March 20, 2024** at no cost. This will be an official College Board SAT score, most juniors first one. As will be discussed in English classes, for Test Day, juniors should determine the **FOUR** colleges/universities they would like to send free SAT score reports. If your junior doesn't know where they will apply just yet, they will be able to send score reports during their senior year (not free, then, however). At the very least, local schools like UMCP, UMBC, Morgan, and Towson U are all popular options for juniors who don't know just yet where they will apply.

Just because a student sends a college a score report, they are under no obligation to follow up with an application senior year. Each time your student takes the SAT, they are offered the opportunity to send four free reports, and many colleges do Superscore across SAT tests, so it doesn't hurt students to send their junior year SAT results to schools. This is a good discussion to have with your junior before SAT Day as they will have limited time on test day to make this choice.

Additionally, on **SAT Test Day**, students will need:

- Their charged BCPS device and the charger. They should take care of any tech concerns before test day.
- Two #2 pencils — for scratch paper notes
- Calculator approved by the College Board with full batteries — or be comfortable with using Desmos in the Blue Book platform because they can use a calculator for EVERY question.
- Bottle of water to stay hydrated and a healthy snack to eat during the break
- Comfortable layers, like a hoodie, in case the testing room is chilly

All juniors are encouraged to take the free SAT practice tests offered in the Blue Book app installed on their BCPS device and to take advantage of free SAT exercises offered in Khan Academy.


